She assisted with the development of a week-long event of workshops, networking activities, office visits, and panel discussions, and helped raise \$40,000 for program scholarships. Through Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Leslie has volunteered as a mentor for female high school students, and through Junior Achievement she taught a class of seventh and eighth graders about career building and the importance of staying in school. She has also volunteered as an interpreter for deaf and hard of hearing members of Messiah St. Bartholomew Episcopal Church.

Steve's leadership has been instrumental in rallying KPMG support for several worthy and important causes. For the Special Olympics, he organized and rallied volunteers and participated in supporting the bicycling and soccer event. Audit Partner, Boston

She is a member of the Board of Boston Partners in Education, which places community volunteers in schools to work with thousands of students. Vicki has focused on expanding the organization's reach to include more children and to provide more services. Vicki is also a volunteer herself, spending an hour every other week during the school year working with a third grader to develop his reading, verbal, and vocabulary skills. He is a board member and member of the planning committee for Camp to Belong, a summer camp for siblings separated through foster/adoptive care. He helps with program administration and has recruited six colleagues to serve as camp counselors. Phil spearheaded two fund-raising events and generated Boston office support through direct contributions and employee contributions using the KPMG Community Giving Campaign. Phil also is personally involved with the youngsters—he volunteers as a camp counselor for a week in August and volunteers for Sibling Sundays year-round. Phil also works with the Ethos Money Management Program, which pairs low-income seniors with professionals who assist them with money management. Phil visits a senior citizen every month, talks to her creditors and social worker, and assists with budgeting and bill paying.

EMMA MONAGHAN

Emma made a major commitment to help a community in Ghana—and her efforts made a big impact. In 2007 she took a leave of absence from the firm and taught 30 young adults at The FrankEve Foundation's Vocational school in the African nation. The school was set up to provide vocational training for students who are homeless or too poor to participate in the regular school system. Emma spent six weeks teaching and raised \$2,500, which paid for desks and chairs for every student, painted classrooms, and purchased the school's first computer. Emma's work at the Ghana school helped young adults gain necessary skills to find a job, become independent, and support their families. This has widespread benefits for the local community in terms of families' standards of living and overall morale. This year, Emma made a commitment to fight serious diseases. She participated in the New York City Triathlon as part of Team in Training (TNT) to raise money to fight leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkins lymphoma, and myeloma and raised more than \$5,000.



JOANNE QUINLAN-ROBERTS

Area Controller, Boston

Joanne's skills, energy, and commitment helped build a dynamic agency that assists more than 2,000 individuals every year. Joanne serves on the board of directors and is board secretary of Family Service, Inc. (FSI), a private, nonprofit social service agency that serves individuals and families in the greater Lawrence, Massachusetts area. Its mission is to help people build skills for successful home, work, and community life. Joanne provides strategic, financial, and business guidance to the agency's management group, and she plays a leading role in supporting its planning and fund-raising efforts. Joanne has helped the agency's management group improve the efficiency of its financial reporting, create budgeting models, develop its strategic planning model, and help focus its goal setting. FSI's budget has reached \$2 million annually with 20 programs currently offered in the areas of child welfare, parent education, youth development, employee assistance, mental health treatment, and suicide prevention.

Most of Emily's volunteer time has been spent at the ESPN XGames in Aspen; she has also traveled to New York, Michigan, and California to attend events and act as a B4BC spokesperson. She has represented the organization on Fuel TV, FSN, MTV U, *Aspen Magazine*, *Snowboarding Magazine*, and in local newspapers. The way Emily sees it, every person she has had the opportunity to talk to and educate is one life she has changed—and with every life she touches, hers becomes more fulfilled.

AMY MATSUO

Amy is an energetic contributor to her community, and a role model for youngsters whom she involves in her activities. She coordinates at least two donation drives a year; this year she spearheaded a fund-raiser for the SPCA and involved her son's kindergarten class. For her children's birthdays, she invites their friends and instead of asking them to bring gifts, she encourages them to bring a donation for a good cause. Amy has set up lemonade stands to raise money for Hurricane Katrina victims, and coordinated the production of treasure boxes for children entering the foster care system. Most weeks, Amy and her children go to a local park and clean litter from the soccer fields and paths. They keep all the aluminum cans to give to charity and recycle whatever they can. On top of that, Amy donates about four hours a month to Habitat for Humanity. The impact Amy is having on her community speaks for itself; her impact on children is huge because she is teaching them to give and care about others.

Nichole dedicates her community service time to the important and uplifting work of the Georgia Firefighters Burn Foundation (GFBF). During the summer, she attends a camp run by GFBF for children who have sustained serious burn injuries. She assists with the management and operations of the facility. Her current role is to provide leadership to the counselors and campers including cabin safety, discipline, and organization. During the holidays, Nichole helps decorate the burn unit at Grady Memorial Hospital and participates in the holiday party at the burn unit for current and former patients. She has worked with about 100 children per year helping develop their self-esteem, providing a safe and caring environment, and giving burn survivors a chance to be around children that have shared experiences.

The BBBS organization noted that the KPMG program was their largest, most successful "Be a Big for a Day" event, and they will use Rebecca's plans when organizing similar future events.



FRED ISAAK

Fred is the founder and driving force behind the Chasing Daylight Tour, a charity bike ride that raises funds for the American Cancer Society in honor of Gene O'Kelly. The Tour, which has grown from 4 people to 23 in its third year, set a goal this year to raise more than \$50,000. With a lot of time, energy, and enthusiasm, the team was able to raise more than \$90,000, surpassing everyone's expectations. Through Fred's initiative, KPMG professionals from all over the country have participated in this annual eight-day bike ride covering more than 600 miles. Fred has built a great support team of KPMG professionals who have helped plan and organize the ride and continue to grow the event, which to date, has raised more than \$120,000. GSC Manager, NSS/Montvale

Jeff shows his big heart and boundless energy every time he commits to a community service project. Jeff has been involved in supporting deployed members of the U.S. Armed Services since 2004, and he created Operation: Kids Care when his nephew was deployed to Iraq. Since then, more than 330 Share Packages have been shipped to more than 150 service men and women overseas; many included a patriotic pillow for them, and toys and candy to be handed out to village children. This effort also expanded to collecting and distributing children's clothing to military families with loved ones deployed. He is also committed to helping the people of New Orleans: Jeff went there with KPMG groups each of the three times he had the opportunity, and participated in gutting houses, insulating, dry walling, and painting. He and his department raised \$500 in donations and brought 1,100 pounds of food when they worked at the Food Bank of New Jersey this past summer. In addition, Jeff has led the Park Church's boys club (Christian Service Brigade).

As *Involve* coordinator for her office, Claire demonstrates infectious leadership that has increased volunteerism at many events.
